
The Book of Lent





The Jubellation Bell Choir held a Pancake Supper on Shrove Tuesday, February 17.

Menus have been predetermined and food will be purchased in advance. Most of the cooking will be done in the St. Stephen kitchen.





St. Stephen Council Minutes

January 28, 2026

Present: Larry Kribs, Mark Stultz, Kevin Strohl, Dave Lang, Michelle Rousseau, Jane Koch. Pastor John

Larry Kribs opened the meeting with prayer.

Jane Koch presented the minutes of the December meeting which were approved as written.

Kevin Strohl gave the financial report:

- The Endowment Committee met with Thrivent Financial Representatives, Brian and Stephanie McCarty on January 14, 2026. To review the quarterly statement format. The Thrivent reps were informed that the Council was in the process of reviewing the Constitution and By-laws.
- According to the December Banker's Report, the church revenue for the month exceeded the expenditures.
- The receipts for 2025 were \$349,275.18 and the expenditures were \$405,840.86. This different from the Treasurer's Report which stated that the receipts were \$349,275.18 with expenditures at \$360,278.14. The receipts may be from the \$13,000 brought over from savings and the Thrivent account. The expenditures need to be explained. Kevin will discuss these differences when he meets with the Finance Team on 2/1/26.

New Business:

- A motion was made and seconded to elect Daniel Holm to the Endowment Committee. Motion passed.
- A motion was made and seconded to appoint Mike Leffler as Council Person at Large. Motion passed.
- Pastor's Report:
 1. The NEO Synod will hold a One Church event at St. Stephen. Date to be determined.
 2. Discussion is on-going with Rejoice! In developing a collaborative effort to share Pastor John with their congregation. If the St. Stephen and Rejoice! Combine in the One Church concept, Rejoice! Will pay St. Stephen \$20,000 for these services.

3. Plans have been made for the Lenten Season. Ash Wednesday worship will be on February 18 at 7 pm. There will be a meal/worship on Maundy Thursday at 6:30pm Good Friday Worship at 7 pm. Rejoice! will participate in our Lenten services.
4. Pastor will be adding a learning opportunity hour during the Sunday School entitled "Living Our Faith in Public" along with asking the congregation to add the practice of reading during Lent.
5. An informal quote was given to Pastor to paint the Fellowship Hall. More information is being requested.
6. Pastor is exploring a possible mission opportunity for adults in Jamaica.
7. A tentative date needs to be explored for a youth outing to Camp Y Noah this summer.

Old Business:

- It was decided that an ad Hoc committee would be established to assess the physical repairs needed at the church. A priority list would be established. Kevin will draft up a proposed resolution for next Council meeting.
- The Council agreed to have a separate date each month to complete the updates to the Constitution and bylaws. A tentative completion date is May 2026.

Next Council Meeting will be February 22 at 10:40 am.

The Constitutional Revision Meeting will be on February 8 at 10:40 am.

The meeting was closed with prayer by Kevin Strohl.


Upcoming Celebration of Life Luncheon

St. Stephen has a New Online Giving Application

To use Servant Keeper Online Giving, scan the QR code or use the URL. (above). Sign-up. Follow the directions and enter your personal email. Update password of your choosing. (An email will be sent to verify). The new password will need to have 8 characters, one capital, one symbol. Add the payment method: credit card or bank account transfer. Schedule. Choose account. Enter amount. Cover Processing Fee to pay for it out of your personal account. Choose frequency. (Weekly, Semi-Monthly, Monthly, Annual) SAVE.

You can change your giving amount or frequency whenever you choose. Once complete, you will receive a confirming email from Servant Keeper.

Servant Keeper will automatically add an app to your device so that you can change your options easily. It will default to a St. Stephen screen when opened and can be used for **Give Now** occasions when you may want to additionally give for other instances, i.e. Mission Support, Be the Change, etc. You can access your scheduled giving by clicking the '3 lines' in the upper left corner.
