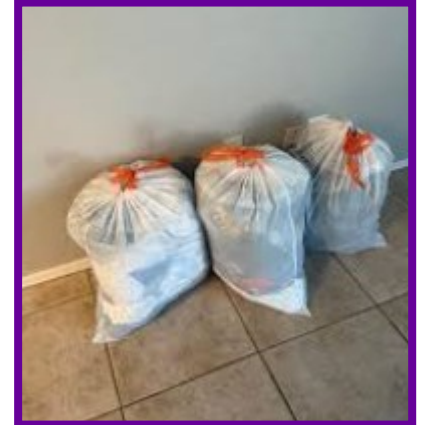
Having Trouble Reaching the Clothing Shed?

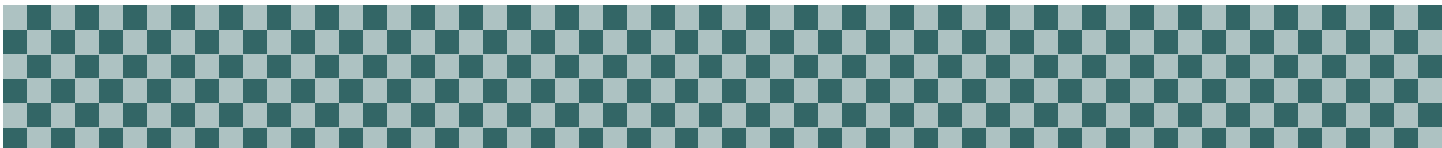

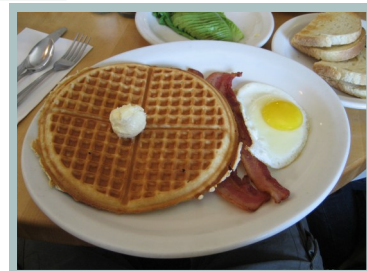

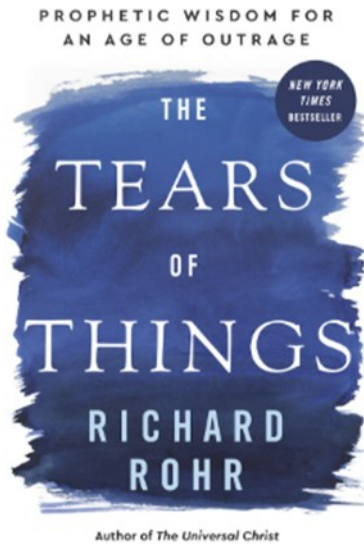

Pastor's Book Recommendation



Book Recommendation:
Richard Rohr's **The Tears of Things – Prophetic Wisdom for an Age of Wisdom**

Fr. Richard Rohr, O.F.M. is a globally recognized Franciscan friar, author, and teacher based in Albuquerque, New Mexico, known for his work in Christian mysticism, contemplation, and action.

The Tears of Things offers prophetic wisdom for an age of outrage, arguing that spiritual maturity requires transforming anger into compassionate lamentation. It explores using the Hebrew prophets to navigate injustice through "sacred criticism" rather than toxic tribalism, emphasizing love and interconnectedness.

Core Themes and Concepts:

- **Prophetic Grieving:** Instead of reacting with rage, the book calls for weeping with the world to avoid falling into cynicism.
- **The Three Stages:** Rohr outlines a journey from order (dualism) to disorder (suffering/sadness) and finally to reorder (loving re-connection).
- **"Sacred Criticism":** An approach that tackles injustice and systemic evil while acknowledging shared humanity.

St. Stephen Council Minutes
April 19, 2026

Present: Larry Kribs, Mike Leffler, Mark Stultz, Kevin Strohl, Dave Lang, Michelle Rousseau, Jane Koch, Pastor John Corsi.

Larry Kribs opened with prayer.

Jane Koch presented the approved minutes for March 5 and March 31, 2026.

Kevin Strohl gave an update on the finances:

- Total receipts for March was \$23,350.00, expenditures were \$26,850.00. To cover the difference and leave money in the checking account \$5000.00 was moved from the Money Market Savings.
- Easter giving was approximately \$6200.00 which is \$1000.00 more than our average weekly giving.
- Synod support for two months was \$1200.00.
- Building and Grounds Repair budget is only 5% over the first quarter. Telephone and internet spending seems over budget for the year as was the gas bill.
- Endowment meeting will be on April 30, 2026.
- The Financial Team requested verification that there is a separate money market account for Endowment monies. Kevin will secure an answer.
- There is a meeting scheduled for April 23, 6 pm for beginning planning for a Fall Festival Fellowship Event to benefit the income for the church. A follow up meeting will be on Sunday, April 26 if needed.

Mike Leffler discussed the Preliminary Maintenance Assessment for the exterior of the needs and further assessment for the interior. After these are both completed, priorities will be made on needed repairs. The Preliminary Assessment gave accurate information and was well done.

Jane Koch presented information from the synod concerning the proposed updated Constitution for St. Stephen. The decision was made to send an electronic copy of the current constitution and the proposed updated constitution so that these documents are printed side by side for easier comparison.

Pastor John shared the following information with the council:

- The Hedrick Family have given a donation of approximately \$22,000.00 to St Stephen in memory of both Elaine and Bob. Also, the Cubbon Memorial of approximately \$20,000.00 remains in total. Council needs to consider the best way to direct this money in coming months.

- There will be a meeting at the Synod Office in Cuyahoga Falls on Saturday, May 16 from 10am – noon to discuss the One Church concept with these congregations: St. Stephen, Stow; Trinity, Kent; St. Mark, Tallmadge; St. Luke, Cuyahoga Falls; Rejoice!, Hudson. The meeting will be facilitated by Pastor Nathan Krause, Assistant to the Bishop for Congregational Vitality and Director for Evangelical Mission. Council members were urged to attend.
- There are numerous groups that are renting our facility. The newest is a Game Group that has asked for a space for a Friday night event. Other groups include an AA Group, Boy and Cub Scouts, and the DAR. There was discussion on how to make the process to rent more consistent.
- August 10, 2026 has been secured for a middle school/high school aged outing at Camp Y-Noah.

The next Council Meeting will be Sunday, May 31, 2026.

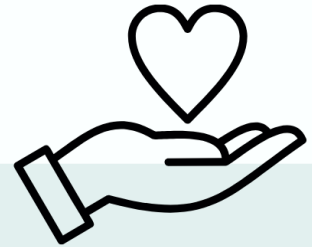

St. Stephen has a New Online Giving Application

To use Servant Keeper Online Giving, scan the QR code or use the URL. (above). Sign-up. Follow the directions and enter your personal email. Update password of your choosing. (An email will be sent to verify). The new password will need to have 8 characters, one capital, one symbol. Add the payment method: credit card or bank account transfer. Schedule. Choose account. Enter amount. Cover Processing Fee to pay for it out of your personal account. Choose frequency. (Weekly, Semi-Monthly, Monthly, Annual) SAVE.

You can change your giving amount or frequency whenever you choose. Once complete, you will receive a confirming email from Servant Keeper.

Servant Keeper will automatically add an app to your device so that you can change your options easily. It will default to a St. Stephen screen when opened and can be used for **Give Now** occasions when you may want to additionally give for other instances, i.e. Mission Support, Be the Change, etc. You can access your scheduled giving by clicking the '3 lines' in the upper left corner.
